2. What misconceptions do residents have about what law enforcement can do, or should be doing, about homelessness in our communities?
3. In what ways does the current system push law enforcement into roles that might be better handled by health, housing, or social service providers?
4. What non-law enforcement resources for those who are unsheltered are you aware of and in what ways are you able to connect those in need with the services [mental health, outreach, minor medical, transportation, etc.]? What are the challenges to connecting those in need to resources?
5. What changes in policy, resources, services, or coordination would make the biggest difference in reducing repeat crisis calls and helping people exit homelessness in Clark County?
6. Where do you see the best opportunities for collaboration between law enforcement and policymakers to make positive changes in our current systems?
7. How are law enforcement agencies working across jurisdictional lines to address homelessness, and are there changes which would support better regional collaboration and communication around homelessness response?
8. If available in your jurisdiction, what is the process to refer someone to Community Court verses citing them into District Court? Are there changes you would suggest improve the referral process for officers?

9. Is there anything else you would want policymakers to understand from your perspective as they work to end homelessness in Clark County?
